


Those eligible for the vaccine are:

- People aged 50 and over
- People at high risk from coronavirus (clinically extremely vulnerable)
- People who live or work in care homes
- Health and social care workers
- People with a condition that puts them at higher risk (clinically vulnerable)
- People with a learning disability
- People who are a main carer for someone at high risk from coronavirus

We will continue to contact people for their second vaccines as soon as deliveries are allocated.

Muslim patients can have Covid vaccines without invalidating their fast during Ramadan, according to advice from national organisations.



Guidance on having a safe Ramadan has been issued by the British Islamic Medical Association and Muslim Council of Britain.

They say that having vaccinations is permitted during the holy month, which this year runs from 12 April to 12 May.



Covid Home Testing Kits

Reading people can now pick up free home testing kits from a variety of local pharmacies to check if they have Covid-19. The move is part of government plans to make it easier for the general public to access lateral flow test, which give results in 30 minutes, and are aimed at people who don't have any symptoms.
